#### DIABETES CORNER:

#### Why is my A1C high when my average blood glucose is in my target range?

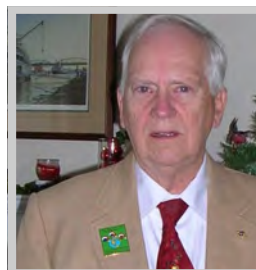
Your average blood glucose is probably based on your pre-meal blood glucose. While this usually works well, it does not take into account the level of your blood glucose after you eat. It may be that your blood glucose is rising unexpectedly after your meal because you are either not taking enough insulin or not taking insulin far enough ahead of eating your meal. To see if this is the reason that your A1C is high, check your blood glucose 2 hours after breakfast, lunch, and dinner for several days (in addition to your pre-meal blood glucose). Blood glucose that is more than 200 mg/dl 2 hours after a meal is too high. In addition, your blood glucose may be high throughout the night, when you are asleep. To find out, wake yourself up at 4 a.m. several times during the week to check your blood glucose. At 4 a.m., blood glucose that is higher than 150 mg/dl is too high. Continue to 4 of 8 check your blood glucose 2 hours after meals and in the middle of the night once a month to be certain that you are not having unexpected high blood glucoses at these times.

We are excited and pleased to have as our special guests this morning Susan Jacobs, Occupational Therapist, and Andrea Lamotte, Classroom Teacher, from the John S. Charlton School. They have brought with them some special guests, Jazmin and Colin, to tell us about their experiences at the horse riding program.

### **Caesar Rodney School District Therapeutic Riding Update**

The Caesar Rodney Therapeutic Riding Program continues to provide great benefit to the John S. Charlton School children. The pilot program, consisting of 5 children with complex cognitive and physical disabilities, enables the children to increase coordination, cognition, body awareness, strengthening, endurance, and communication.

Children in the program, who endure cerebral palsy, have increased their endurance by approximately 70%. They are trotting their horses with less assist and greater trunk control. In addition their motor planning has improved aboard the horse, and in the classroom. Moreover, their fine motor skills have improved significantly, and one child is even forming the letters in her name, which she had great difficulty with in the past.

The children who had speech deficits are speaking with improved volume and clarity. This has carried over in the classroom setting, therefore, helping the children have greater success communicating in the inclusion setting.

The greatest benefit is the increased self-esteem and confidence the children receive from their weekly riding sessions. They continue to grow more confident in facing new challenges, and tasks in the educational environment. Overall the program is a big success for the kids, and I feel certain they would give you a big thumbs up in favor of therapeutic riding!

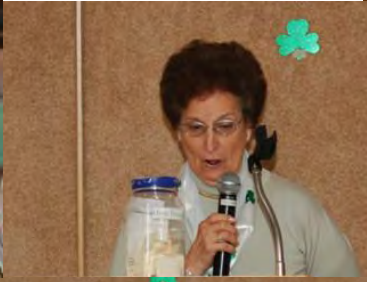
