Diabetes Corner:

What are the best foods to eat when I am sick?

Since you need to stick to your regular diabetes medication when you are sick, it's important to eat something, even when you can't eat regular food. Most people find that things like regular soda, fruit juice, sherbet, frozen juice bars, pudding, apple-sauce, and ice cream are the easiest to eat, but anything with calories that you can keep down will do. Dehydration is a real risk if your blood glucose stays high for a long period of time. So fluids like soda and juice are especially good when you are sick, because they help protect you from dehydration. Broth and vegetable juices are also good, because they help replace the minerals you lose through vomiting and diarrhea.

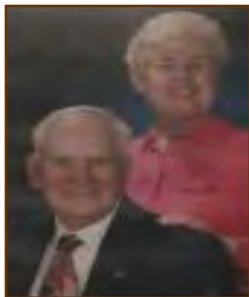

Wow! Do I Have An Idea For You (In February 2012)

First, A Question: Where can you go for a fun-filled educational weekend with lots of great Lions and lots of great food?

When I initially read about the Leadership weekend, I was a bit timid to inquire, thinking this must be for "seasoned" Lions or those aspiring to become International Presidents, or such...(frankly, the word "Leadership" caused me to pause)...
