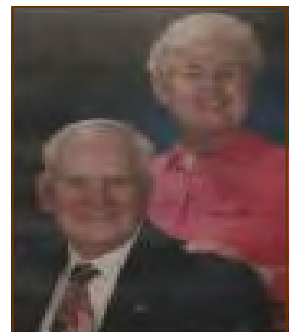

Diabetes Corner:

What should my A1C be to avoid complications?

There is no magic A1C number that guarantees you will not develop complications. However, the lower your A1C level, the less likely you are to get diabetes complications. It now seems that even slightly elevated A1C levels carry some increased risk for complications like heart disease and stroke. Unfortunately, very few people can get their A1C levels as low as they are in people who don't have diabetes; we don't have the tools to achieve this goal, and the amount of work and the increased risk of low blood glucose make it impossible for most people to manage. So all people with diabetes carry some increased risk of developing complications.



Trying to be realistic, the American Diabetes Association says people with diabetes should aim for A1C levels of 7% or less. That's the equivalent of 150 mg/dl average blood glucose. The ADA suggests that you take action and talk with your health care provider about changes in your treatment if your A1C is higher than 8% (the equivalent of 180 mg/dl average blood glucose). The most important thing to keep in mind is this: Any improvement in your A1C reduces your risk of getting diabetes complications. A small improvement reduces your risk a little, and a big improvement reduces your risk a lot. But every improvement reduces your risk.



Milwaukee was fantastic!!! Those who attended will attest to the quality of the seminars as well as the speakers. Ross Bernstein was first on Thursday evening and talked about "What Is Your Passion?" which focused on the issue that makes a person truly a Lion. A noted author, he also is an avid hockey fan, who wrote about Herb Brooks, who was unfortunately cut from the 1960 American hockey team that won the Olympic gold medal. It was that action that made Herb Brooks a person driven to be the best at the game he loved, hockey. Later in his life, Herb Brooks went on to coach the 1980 American hockey team, which won the gold medal. But the best part of Herb Brooks' life was helping young hockey players to become better people by being a mentor, one who loved his players as much as he loved the game. Ross Bernstein's message was that Lions need to find that one thing that ignites our passion and which will make us better people, better Lions.

Of course there was much to learn at the seminars, and one of the best was presented by MD-22 Lions PDG Paul "Hawk" Hawkins, his wife Dee, and Lion Brindisi Chan. All who attended this seminar felt that it needs to be seen by all Lions, as it addresses the issue of younger people versus older, entrenched Lions. Outstanding seminar!! Hopefully some day you will be able to see this trio perform their great presentation!

And shopping there was for anyone who wanted to spend, and great restaurants! German food was prevalent and delicious! Where there is German food, one will find sehr gut bier!!! Several breweries had tours available, with the most memorable tour for me was at the Lakefront Brewery, where samples of four different beers were provided. Stein Lager was good; Pumpkin Ale was interesting, Oktoberfest yummy and Monkey Wheat tasted like the Monkey bathed in it!!! All in all, good times were available.
