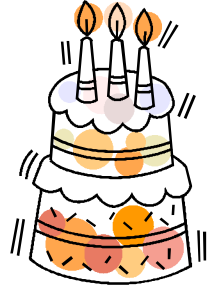

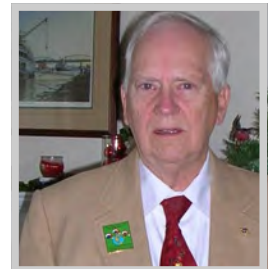

Diabetes Corner:

Am I going to have a heart attack?

Diabetes does put you at a much higher risk for a heart attack, so you should adopt the health practices of people who've already had one. This may prevent you from ever having one. The things that contribute to developing diabetes, such as being overweight, inactivity, smoking, hypertension, and blood fat disorders, also put you at risk for heart disease. You can control these factors (lose weight, stop smoking, etc.) and reduce the added risk to your heart. Because of the damage that diabetes does to nerve pathways, you may not be able to feel chest pain if you are having angina or a heart attack. Be aware of your blood pressure and pulse rate, especially when you are exercising. Be aware that your only symptoms of a heart attack may be tiredness, shortness of breath, or indigestion. Ask your doctor about heart tests, such as a stress test or arteriogram. If you have heart problems, they can be treated.

Membership Social

Holding a membership social for prospective members is a **PROVEN** way of getting new members. The work begins with each club member being given a form with spaces to list individuals who they think would be good members of the club. Then a team should contact each individual listed and invite them to the social. This can be done by letter (sample attached) or by personal contact. If a letter is sent it should be followed up with a phone call.

The social should not be a regular club meeting but a informal gathering. Refreshments should be available, finger foods and soda, coffee. The club should display brochures about **LIONS** and **MEMBERSHIP APPLICATIONS**. The club should display pictures of the club working and presenting awards and checks, also display any newspaper articles they have. Members should mix with the guests and discuss their experiences as **LIONS**. There should be 2 or three speakers explaining what the club does and the responsibilities of members, dues, attendance, etc. Keep the speeches short and make sure that there is time for a question and answer period. Having a guest speaker such as a PDG or membership chair can be beneficial.

Attempt to get all guests to fill out a membership application. If they do not want to, make sure they take one with them. The team must follow up on all attendees and get their input as to what they thought and what they think of **LIONS** and why they want to or do not want to join.
